It was just like putting \$2,000 in the church's collection plate. That's the staggering sum they were told it would cost to paint and varnish the trim on the brick church on E. 14 Mile road.

Referring to it in his recent "Pastor's Column" in the church's bulletin, Rev. H. G. Allwardt, who always refers to himself, his wife and children as "Parsonage Folks," had this to say:

"We do know that \$2,000 in the pocket feels pretty good at a time when we are pinching to get our addition on the way. Let there be any misinterpretation, we are speaking of the school addition and not of the Parsonage Folks."
