### Hills B of E Re-Elects Bates As President

Bloomfield Hills board of education last week re-elected Merrill O. Bates president at its annual organizational meeting. Board newcomers are Mrs. Jean B. Martz and Max Miller were named secretary and treasurer, respectively, to succeed Douglas Jocelyn and Robert Hoffman.

At its meeting the board studied plans for the Westview road fire station to be built on Eastover school grounds and made plans to deed the 150-foot site to Bloomfield township. It voted to request that water rights for the school promised by the township be made part of the contract.

SUPERINTENDENT Eugene L. Johnson reported that construction still is not on schedule at the junior high school but that it will be available for the start of school.

Johnson said that Pine Lake elementary school also will have a close completion date. Lack of glass, he added, has been a delaying factor in the Eastover elementary school addition. All, however, are expected to be in use this fall.

The board approved hiring of eight additional teachers.

### Acquiring Last Three Parcels



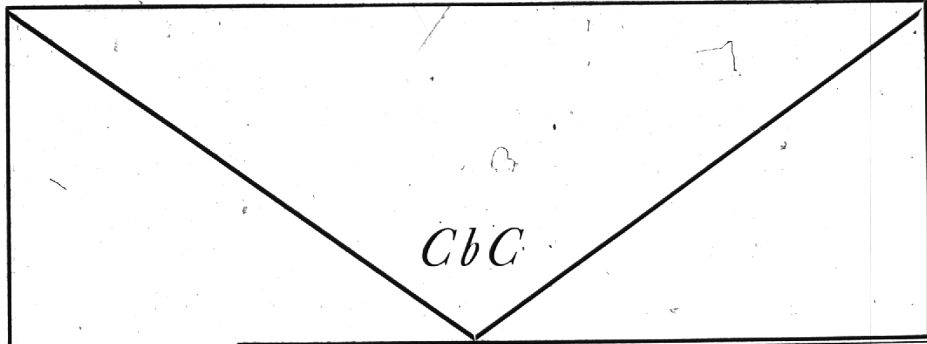
