## Trash Collection Starts Tuesday

Refuse trucks will start their rounds Tuesday in Westlady village's own collection program. Up to now the village has been contracting for collection on a month to month basis. This map shows the permanent collection day for each area. The trucks will start around at 7:30 a.m. Village regulations include: Containers and contents should weigh no more than 60 pounds each. Empty containers must be re-

moved after collection. Paper and other household burnables as well as tins and bottles may go into the same 10 or 20-gallon container. Grass clippings, weeds and dirt must be in a separate container. Bush and tree branches must be no larger than an inch in diameter, cut in four foot lengths and tied into bundles. Special arrangements may be made for collection of bulkier items and garbage.

## S'field Man to Attend Driver Institute

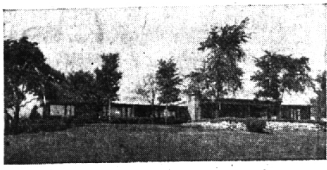
