Tuesday Deadline For Filing Tennis Tourney Entries

Junior Events Most Popular

Birmingham area tennis enthusiasts have just six days—until Tuesday noon—left to file their entries for the first Community Tennis tournament.

The tourney is cosponsored by The Birmingham Eclectic and the city recreation department and will be played Aug. 11-17 on Eton park's six courts.

Entries—there is a blank published on this page—may be mailed or brought in person, if time is running short, to The Eclectic's sports department.

A STEADY influx of entries since the first announcement of the tournament two weeks ago indicates the singles divisions in the junior age group—for boys and girls 17 years old and under—will draw the most contestants.

Medals will be awarded champions and runners-up in all eight divisions.

In addition, the Varsity Shop has donated handsome revolving trophies to remain with the eight champions for a year.

All residents of the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills school districts and Laditup are eligible to compete. Singles and doubles divisions are scheduled for boys and girls and for men and women 18 and over.

PAIRINGS WILL be made Tuesday afternoon by tournament director Le Parré. He will be as-

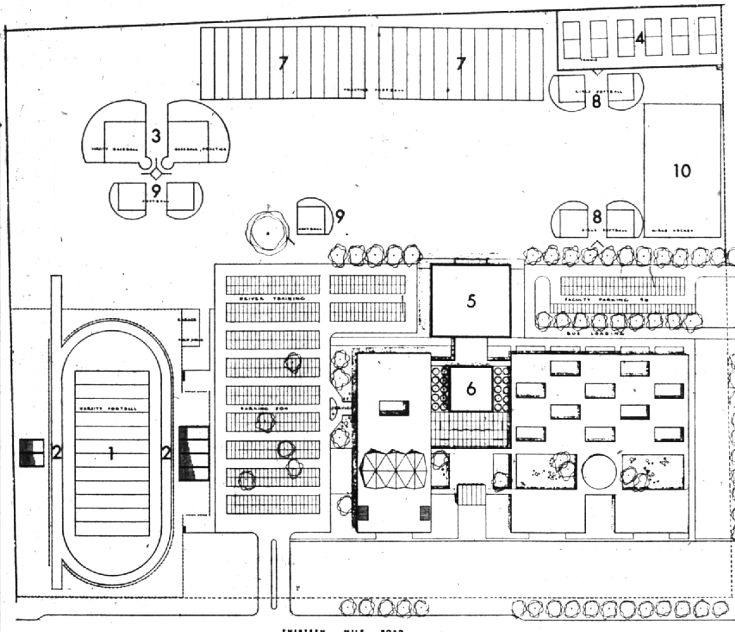
isted by city recreation director Robert E. Girardin, Ray Sackett, Birmingham Tennis club representative, and The Eclectic's sports editor.

Top players in all divisions will be seeded.

Pairings will be announced in the Aug. 7 issue of The Eclectic, and the city recreation office in the municipal building.

The Sports Layout . . .

This site plan for Birmingham's new junior-senior high school at Thirteenth Mile and Evergreen roads shows the layout of the athletic plant. The sports facilities, in darker outline, are numbered as follows: 1—varsity football field; 2—track; 3—baseball fields; 4—tennis courts; 5—gymnasium; 6—swimming pool; 7—practice football fields; 8—girls softball diamonds; 9—additional softball fields; 10—girls hockey field. Smith, Tarapata and MacMahon, Inc., 894 S. Adams, are the architects for the new school.

The Swimming Pool . . .

This is an artist's conception of the new Birmingham junior-senior high school's swimming pool. Included in the design, by the local architectural firm of Smith, Tarapata and MacMahon, are a glass wall and a patio for warm-weather use. The pool will have seating on both sides and will accommodate 1,000 spectators.

Plan Outstanding Athletic Plant for New B'ham High

Birmingham's new south high school will have one of Michigan's finest prep athletic plants.

Plans for the junior-senior high's sports facilities were released this week. Birmingham architects Smith, Tarapata and MacMahon are the designers.

Unlike the present Birmingham high—where construction of athletic facilities was done piecemeal—the new school, at Thirteenth Mile and Evergreen roads, will have its complete layout immediately.

"A wonderful setup," is what Birmingham athletic director Frank Whitney termed the planned athletic layout.

WHITNEY HAS worked closely with architects and the citizens' advisory committee for several months in planning the sports layout for the south school.

Included in the facilities will be a 3,400-seat football stadium. The stadium will not be lighted immediately, but will be constructed so that lighting can be easily installed.

A six-lane track will circle the stadium. It will have a 220-yard straightaway.

Six tennis courts will be built off Evergreen road on the north edge of the school property. There will be two practice football fields, two baseball diamonds and several softball diamonds for both boys and girls activities. A girls hockey field is also planned.

THE SCHOOL parking lot will hold 600 cars and the gymnasium, which will have a stage, missing in the present high school, will fire at 25 targets in each of three fields—trap, skeet and the bird field.

TOP SCORE ever posted in the tournament, sponsored by Williams Gun Sight Co., was a 71 by Mack Seagraves of the Lansing police department, who shot 1065. Shooters will be available in the club room.

Tim Springer notched his third win of the season Sunday. He gave up seven hits in the nine-inning stint.

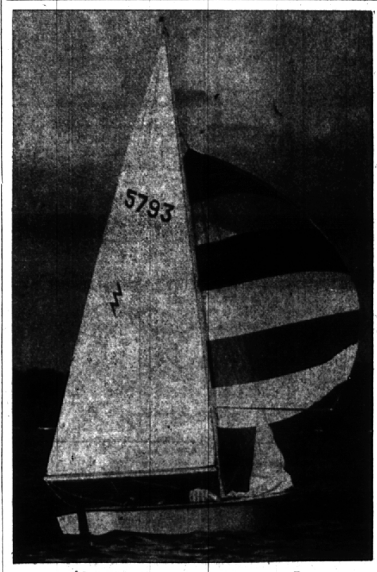
Birmingham scored twice in the second and third innings and added single runs in the fifth and eighth frames.
