**F. Dean Burnetts Return From 7 Weeks in Europe**

Mr. and Mrs. F. Dean Burnett and their daughter, Barbara, 9, of Weatherlane road, have just returned home after seven weeks in Europe.  
 Each time the diary Mrs. Burnett kept will be opened, the trip will be once again relived by the Burnetts and their friends for many years to come. They flew to Shannon, Ireland, then on to Paris, by way of Mount Blanc, which is the highest mountain in Europe.  
 They arrived in Rome on Easter, and spent a week seeing the Vatican city and the picturesque park close by with its clock that is run completely by water. They visited the Colosseum and saw the many artistic fountains. St. Peter's cathedral and the Spanish steps. Much of their touring was done in open buggies so nothing could escape them.  
 Then on by train to Naples, Pompeii, and Positano. On the way to Positano they motored along the Coliseum and stopped at the Cappuccini monastery on the top of cliffs overlooking the Mediterranean. Sorrento and a boat to Capri were other memorable stops.

 Six days went too quickly in Venice, with its Bell tower and Clock tower that dates back 400 years. St. Marcos square with its pigeons and two orchestras that play continuously still long to be remembered, as will the Gritti palace.  
 Then there were the gondola rides and the one time Burnett had to do some "fast talking" in order to convince the gondolier to let him do the driving for awhile.  
 A week was spent at Portofino, a quaint seaside town where they again met the Foggiati family for a day. Another three days were spent viewing the Alps just across the Swiss border.  
 Armored cars and police were everywhere in Paris but the Burnetts found no rioting among the civilians. While in Paris they toured the Eiffel tower, Arch of Triumph, Church of Sacre Coeur in the Montmartre section, the Moulin Rouge and Folies Bergere. They also stopped in at "The Frog" on the Eastbank.  
 In London, they toured the Tower of London, St. Paul's cathedral, the changing of the guards at Buckingham palace, Old Curiosity shoppe and Scotland yard. They were surprised to see parts of the city still in the rubble of the last war.  
 Prestwick, Scotland and Montreal, Canada, were their last stops before arriving home.
