Grace Keller Crowned Queen

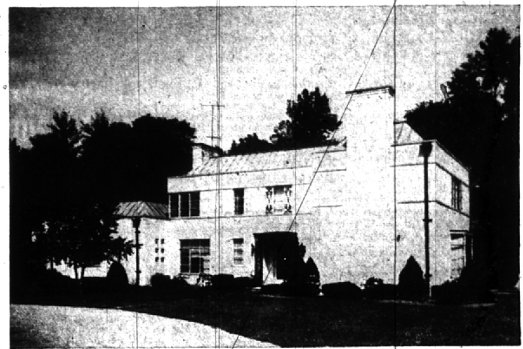

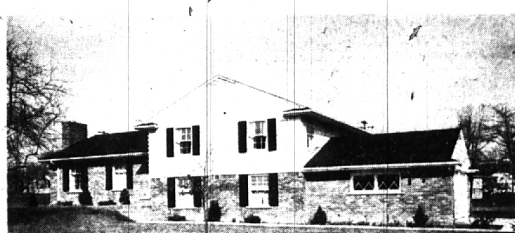
