ORDINANCE NO. 12

AN ORDINANCE FOR SAFEGUARDING LIFE AND PROPERTY BY REGULATING AND PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF THE INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRICAL WIRING, ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT, AND ELECTRICAL MATERIALS, PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGISTRATION OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS AND JOURNEYMEN; PROVIDING FOR A BOARD OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS AND JOURNEYMEN; AND EXAMINATION OF LICENSES ISSUED BY OTHER MUNICIPALITIES; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

The Village of Westwood Ordinance: Section 1. From and after the effective date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to install, alter or repair any electrical equipment, electrical wiring or electrical material in pursuance of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 2. Creation of Board. There is hereby created the Electrical Board of the Village of Westwood, Michigan, known hereinafter as the "Electrical Board" which shall consist of: 1. A representative of the Village Council who may or may not be a member of the Village Council.

2. A licensed electrical contractor engaged in the business of electrical contracting for five years or more within the Village of Westwood. 3. A licensed journeyman electrician residing in the Village of Westwood who has been employed for at least three years by electrical contractors in Oakland County.

4. A representative of an electric utility supplying electrical energy within the Village of Westwood. 5. The Electrical Inspector appointed by the Village Council.

Section 3. Personnel of Electrical Boards, Term-Removal. Members of said Electrical Board, except the Electrical Inspector, shall be appointed for a term of one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1959, and thereafter their successors shall be appointed for terms of one year. Any member of the Board may be removed from office by the Village Council for cause after a public hearing. Such members shall be entitled to appear and present evidence in his behalf at such public hearing. Members of the Electrical Board except the Electrical Inspector shall be appointed by the Village Council under such terms of employment as the Village Council may designate.

Section 4. Powers and Duties of the Board. The Electrical Board shall hold regular meetings every other month, and shall hold special meetings at the call of the chairman or upon the written request of a majority of the members. The Board shall annually elect a chairman whose term shall expire on December 31. Three members of the Electrical Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but any action shall require the concurring vote of at least three members for disposition of an issue.

Section 5. Powers of the Electrical Board. The Electrical Board is authorized to: 1. Issue licenses to qualified applicants who have paid the prescribed fee; to revoke or suspend such licenses for sufficient cause; to grant such licenses to qualified applicants who have paid the prescribed fee; to revoke or suspend such licenses for sufficient cause; to grant such licenses to qualified applicants who have paid the prescribed fee; to revoke or suspend such licenses for sufficient cause.

Section 6. Adoption of the National Electrical Code. The current edition of the National Electrical Code, Standard of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, or any other code of practice as recommended by the National Fire Protection Association, shall be the standard for the installation, alteration, repair, alteration, operation and maintenance of electrical wiring, apparatus or fixtures except insofar as it may be modified by the Board in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 7. Licenses, Classes, Exceptions. No person, partnership, nor corporation shall provide for the installing, altering or repairing of electrical equipment without first obtaining a license from the Electrical Board. A certificate for an electrical contractor's or electrical journeyman's license, nor shall any person undertake to perform any work of installing, altering, or repairing electrical equipment, unless such person shall be duly licensed as an electrical journeyman (except helpers and apprentices permitted by rules of the Electrical Board) and be employed by a person who holds a license as the holder of a certificate for an electrical contractor's license, except that no license shall be required in order to execute or perform any of the following classes of electrical work:

1. Minor repair work, including the replacement of lamps and the connection of approved portable devices to suitable receptacles which are regularly maintained in accordance with the rules of the Electrical Board. 2. The installation, alteration, or repair of electrical equipment installed on the premises of customers or subscribers by Public Utilities Companies supplying electrical energy, signal or communication systems, or by other companies in the generation, transmission, distribution, or metering of electrical energy.

3. Any installation of electrical equipment in a single family and separate outbuildings, or the installation, alteration or repair of such electrical equipment where provision is made for inspection of the completed installation of electrical equipment by the Electrical Board. 4. Installation, alteration, or repair of electrical equipment in factories or other establishments regularly employing qualified electricians.

Section 8. Powers and Limitations of Licenses. There shall be two classes of licenses as follows: 1. An electrical contractor's license shall entitle the holder thereof to provide for the installing, altering, or repairing of electrical equipment within the Village of Westwood. 2. A journeyman's license shall entitle the holder thereof to perform any work of installing, altering, or repairing electrical equipment as an electrical journeyman under the direction of the holder of a contractor's license by whom he is employed.

Section 9. Reciprocal Licenses. The Village of Westwood shall permit Electrical Contractors lawfully licensed by other municipalities within the State of Michigan to install, alter or repair electrical equipment, apparatus or fixtures for light, heat or power purposes within the corporate limits of the Village of Westwood upon the payment of one dollar (\$1.00) registration fee. The Village of Westwood shall reciprocate in recognizing Electrical Contractors who are duly licensed under the provisions of this ordinance, granting them the same privilege of doing work within the Village of Westwood without the payment of a registration fee, provided that such reciprocal arrangement shall be permitted to work in the Village of Westwood without the payment of a registration fee, provided that such reciprocal arrangement shall be permitted to work in the Village of Westwood without the payment of a registration fee.

No Electrical Contractors' Licenses shall be recognized for the purpose of registration by the Village of Westwood of applicants, who are maintaining their principal place of business and whose licenses are not approved, by affirmative action of this Legislative Body the reciprocal and mutually interchangeable licensing arrangements covered by this ordinance.

Section 10. License Fees. Before a license is granted to any applicant, the applicant shall pay the Village Clerk a fee of \$25.00 for a contractor's license, a \$10.00 for a journeyman's license and \$1.00 for license registration of reciprocal contractor's license. Each license shall expire on December 31 following the date of its issuance and shall be renewed by the Electrical Board upon application of the applicant and payment of the holder of the license and payment of the required fee at any time before the date of expiration or within 60 days thereafter.

Section 11. Applications for Licenses, Forms. Each application for a license shall be made in writing to the Village Clerk on a form prescribed by the Electrical Board. The application shall include the name of the licensed electrician representing the applicant who will act as supervisor for all work to be done under the license, and shall accompany the application. The required representative of each applicant for a contractor's or journeyman's license shall be examined to determine if he meets the required standards for electrical equipment and its installation and to determine the general qualifications and fitness of the applicant for requesting the license.

Section 12. Qualification for License, Examinations. The designated representative of each applicant for a contractor's or journeyman's license shall be examined by the Electrical Board. The Electrical Board shall conduct such examination or authorize the applicant to be examined by the examining board of another municipality. The examination shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, and in this event at least one member of the Electrical Board shall be present at the examination. Only persons who are eligible for a journeyman's license shall have had three years experience as an apprentice or a helper, or shall have had two years technical training in a recognized trade school and one year practical experience as an apprentice. The Electrical Board shall adopt rules and regulations for the conduct of examinations and all examinations shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Electrical Board.

A complete record of every examination shall be kept on file for at least three years. Section 13. Certificate of Licensing, Display. Each certificate for a license issued in accordance with the provisions of this act shall specify the names of the person, partnership or corporation licensed, to be held by the holder of the license, and the name of the supervisor who shall specify the name of the licensed electrician who has passed the examination and who shall act as supervisor of all work to be done under the license. No electrical contractor's license or journeyman's license shall be issued unless the holder of the license is assigned to supervise the work to be done under said license. Every holder of an Electrical Contractor's license shall keep his certificate of license displayed in a conspicuous place in his principal

place of business. No license issued in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance shall be assignable or transferable. Section 14. Suspension. After hearing, any license may be revoked or suspended for a period of not over thirty days, at the discretion of the Electrical Board, if it shall appear that the holder of such license has failed to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, or if statements upon the application for a license or has violated any order, rule or regulation of the Electrical Board or the provisions of this ordinance. No license shall be reinstated until the holder thereof has reported on installations made by the licensee shall have been corrected.

Section 15. Permits. No alterations or additions shall be made in the structure of any building or structure or in the building or structure of Westwood nor shall any building or structure in the Village of Westwood be wired for the placing of any electric lights, motors, heating or air conditioning equipment, or any other electrical energy, nor shall any alterations be made in the wiring of any building after inspection, without first notifying the Electrical Board, and securing a permit therefor.

The application for such permit shall be in writing upon such form and furnish such information as may be designated by the Electrical Board and shall be filed with the office of the Electrical Board or by the licensed electrical contractor undertaking the work. Section 16. Right of Access to Buildings. The Electrical Inspector and/or his deputy shall have the right during reasonable hours to enter any building in the discharge of his official duties or for the purpose of making any inspection or test of the installation of electrical wiring, electric devices and/or electric material contained therein, not shall have the authority to cause the turning off of an electric supply and cut or disconnect, in cases of emergency, any wire where such action is necessary to prevent injury to life or property or to interfere with the work of the Fire Department.

Section 17. Inspection. Upon the completion of the wiring of any building or structure, the holder of the person, firm or corporation installing the same to notify the Electrical Board, who shall notify the Electrical Inspector to inspect the installation as soon as possible and does not constitute a hazard to life and property, he shall issue to such person, firm or corporation for delivery to the owner a certificate of inspection of the current. All wires which are to be hidden from view shall be concealed in such a manner as to be readily accessible for inspection. The Electrical Board shall notify the Electrical Board giving sufficient time in which to make the required inspection before such wires are concealed.

Section 18. Re-inspection. The Electrical Inspector may make periodically a thorough re-inspection of the installation in buildings of all electrical wiring, electric devices and/or electric material in buildings that may hereafter be installed, within the Village of Westwood, and when the installation of any such wiring, devices, and/or material is in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, the Electrical Inspector shall issue a notice of violation, and the holder of the license shall make the necessary repairs or changes required to place wiring, devices and/or material in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance within fifteen days or any longer period specified by the Electrical Inspector in said notice. The Electrical Inspector is hereby empowered to require the removal of any electrical wiring, devices and/or material found to be defectively installed until the installation of such wiring, devices and material has been made in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 19. Construction Requirements. No certificate of inspection shall be issued unless the electrical installation is in strict compliance with the provisions of this ordinance, and the rules and regulations of the State of Michigan, the rules and regulations issued by the Michigan Public Utilities Commission and the rules and regulations of the Electrical Board, and the Electrical Board shall have the authority to adopt general rules and regulations for safety to persons and property.

Section 20. Fees. The Village Council shall adopt a schedule of fees, to be charged for inspection of installations, devices, apparatus and equipment in the Village of Westwood. The money so received shall be deposited in the Treasury as a special fund for the use of the Village, and such part as may be necessary, used to pay the expenses of the inspection herein authorized.

Section 21. Records. The Electrical Inspector or his deputy shall keep complete records of all permits issued and inspections made, and other official work performed under the provisions of this ordinance, which records shall be kept on file in his office and shall be public property. Section 22. Connections, Public Utilities. It shall be unlawful for any Public Utility to make connection from a source of electrical energy, or for any electrician, contractor, partnership, or corporation to install, alter or repair electrical equipment, without securing from the person, partnership, or corporation responsible for the installation of such electrical equipment a certificate of inspection from the Electrical Board certifying that electrical equipment was installed in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. The Public Utility may be ordered by the Electrical Board to cut off such service if the installation of electrical equipment does not conform to the adopted standards 10 days after the date of such certificate of inspection, provided, that such service shall not be cut off until 6 days after the occupants of the premises served have been given due notice that such defects have been discovered.

Section 23. Liability Under Ordinance. This ordinance shall not be construed to lessen the responsibility or liability of any person, firm, or corporation owning, operating, controlling, or installing any electric wiring, electric devices and/or electric material installed in buildings, or for any cause, by any person, firm, or corporation, shall the Village of Westwood be held as assuming any liability by reason of the inspection authorized herein, or certificate of inspection issued hereunder.

Section 24. Each section of this ordinance and every part of each section are hereby declared to be independent sections and parts of this ordinance, and the invalidity of any section or part thereof shall be ineffective, or unconstitutional for any cause shall not affect any other section or part thereof.

Section 25. Any person, firm or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof by any justice of the peace within the County of Oakland, Michigan, shall be fined a sum not exceeding \$100.00, or imprisoned for a term not exceeding 30 days, or both, such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section 26. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Electrical Ordinance" of the Village of Westwood. Section 27. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance which is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon publication.
