

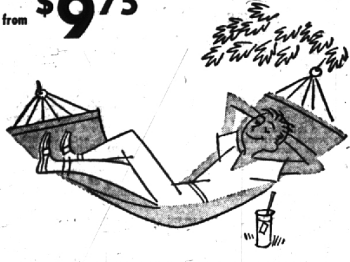

ORDINANCE NO. 530  
CITY OF BIRMINGHAM

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 527

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-1.

The City of Birmingham Ordains:  
Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance Number 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-1, said Section 3.3-1 to read as follows:

Section 3.3-1. Property on the north side of Haynes, east of the sidewalk opposite Torry Street extended, described as Lots 114, 115, 116, 117, 118 and 119 of Adams Village Subdivision shall be changed from its present classification of R-2, Single-Family Residential Zone District, to R-4, Two-Family Residential Zone District.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.  
Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 2nd day of June, 1958, to be effective upon publication.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 527

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-2.

The City of Birmingham Ordains:  
Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance Number 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-2, said Section 3.3-2 to read as follows:

Section 3.3-2. Property on the southeast corner of Landon and Ann, described as Lots 12, 13 and 14 of Grove Addition shall be changed from its present classification of R-6, Multiple-Family Residential Zone District to B-2, Neighborhood Business Zone District.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.  
Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 2nd day of June, 1958, to be effective upon publication.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.3 OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 527 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, AND THE ZONING MAP, BY ADDITION OF A SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 3.3-3.

The City of Birmingham Ordains:  
Section 1. That Section 3.3 of Article 3 of Ordinance Number 527 be amended by addition of a section to be known as Section 3.3-3, said Section 3.3-3 to read as follows:

Section 3.3-3. Property on the north side of Bowers, extending east from Elm Street, described as Lots 4, 5 and 6, Block 9, Campbell Subdivision, and Lots 85, 86, 87, 88 and 89 of Snow Subdivision No. 1 shall be changed from its present classification of R-2, Single-Family Residential Zone District, to B-2, Neighborhood Business Zone District.

Section 2. The Zoning Map attached to Ordinance No. 527 shall be deemed modified to incorporate this change.  
Ordained by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 2nd day of June, 1958, to be effective upon publication.
