REV. WALTER PEDERSEN

New Minister Called, Rev. Lincoln Honored

A Unitarian minister who is now associated with the Cleveland Ethical society, the Rev. Walter Pedersen has answered a call to become minister of the Unitarian church of Birmingham, beginning Aug. 22.

Mr. Pedersen will fill a vacancy created by the resignation of the Rev. Russell L. Lincoln, who Sunday preached his last sermon at the local church. Members of the church honored Mr. and Mrs. Lincoln at a reception following the service, the last before fall.

Mr. Lincoln will become minister of a new Unitarian congregation in San Mateo, Calif.

MR. PEDERSEN was graduated from Harvard divinity school in

1933. After several Unitarian pastorates, he was with the Red Cross in Okinawa and Japan during World War II. He stayed on with the education section of civil affairs of the occupation government, working on democratic re-orientation of Japanese educators and leaders.

The Pedersens have a daughter, Carol, who is 17. Mrs. Pedersen, now a remedial reading instructor at Western Reserve college, Cleveland, holds a Ph.D. in child psychology.

Board Chairman Taup Resigns
