**Dr. Harris Appointed to Commission**

Named to an important commission appointed at the Presbytery's general assembly in Pittsburgh recently is the Rev. Dr. F.W. Glen Harris, minister of First Presbyterian church, Birmingham.

Dr. Harris, of 1017 Pilgrim, Birmingham, has been elected to this commission on ecumenical mission and relations of the new United Presbyterian church in the USA.

The commission takes the place of five board of foreign missions and committees on inter-church relations.

Its first meeting was held in New York City Monday.

Creation of the commission marks the opening of a new chapter in overseas Christian work, it was pointed out by the Rev. Dr. Charles T. Leber, general secretary of the commission. Since Christian churches now are organized in most nations of the world, emphasis shifts from the missionary, seeking to start new churches, to the fraternal worker, offering cooperation to overseas churches.

**Rev. Philip Gentile Begins Duties Here July 1**

The Rev. Philip Gentile will begin his duties as associate minister of Community Congregational church, Lathrup, July 1.

Mr. Gentile was born in Providence, R. I., and received his early education in Detroit, obtaining his BA degree from Wayne State university. He received an MA from Northwestern university in religious education.

He was director of youth and later director of religious education at Metropolitan Methodist church, Detroit, later serving as youth director at Central Methodist church.

From 1945-51 he was vice president of Adrian college, in charge of public relations.

Since then he has been associate pastor of Strathmoor Methodist church.

He has held many positions of leadership in his denomination and in his community.

Mr. Gentile is also an authority on the folk games and dances of other nations. Mrs. Gentile is a former teacher at Wayne State university and has had the honor of representing the United States as delegate to the United Nations.

They have one son, Philip A., who is married, lives in St. Clair Shores and teaches science and mathematics in East Detroit high school.

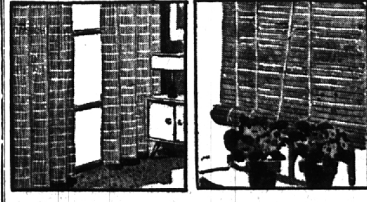
Highlighting the program for the Baptist women and other phases will be speakers who will discuss missionary work and other phases.

**Medical Mirror**  
 WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

• Summer Hazards (One in a series of discussions about summer health problems)

Q. What are doctors doing to help reduce highway slaughter which seems especially ruthless during summer?

A. They are developing better ways of treating the injured and have suggested many safety devices and changes in automobile design. Mechanical improvements are important but this is only part of the answer to headless horsepower. As one medical writer said, the main trouble is with the heavyfooted fellow behind the wheel. He is lectured, legislated at, prayed for, and preached to but quickly forgets everything save his sense of power when he steps on the gas. The results are ghastly.

Q. Are expensive tinted lenses better than ordinary sunglasses for use in bright sunlight?

A. Studies among Atlantic City lifeguards seem to indicate that ordinary sunglasses sold in drug stores serve the purpose about as well as many of the more expensive types.

Q. Can rattlesnakes see well enough at night to strike?

A. Rattlesnakes "see" in the dark by means of heat-sensitive strike warmblooded animals (including man) even in total darkness.
