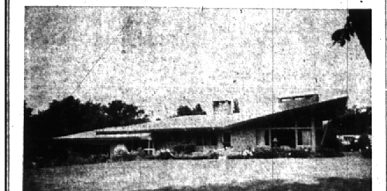

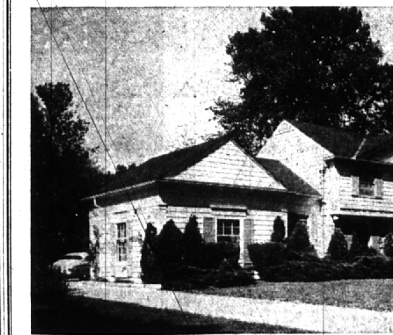
Cubs Make Plans For Pack Picnic

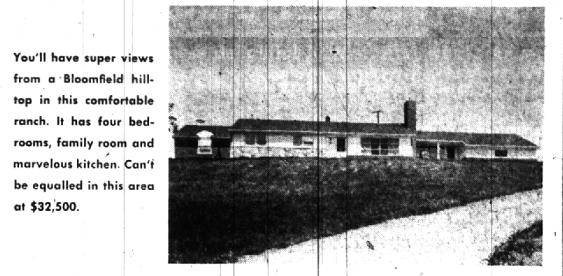
