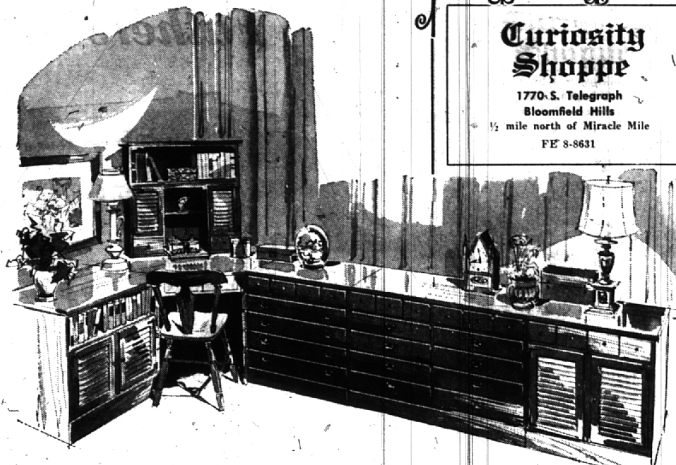
Mrs. Olson wore a gown of beige organza and lace sheath and mother of the groom selected a seafoam chiffon gown. Both mothers had orchids.
