These achievements boosted to 35 the number of major titles which she has won. Among other feats, she has taken the prized Fritcheholders crown seven times.

She holds the women's 18-hole record, a sizzling 64 which she turned in at the Richmond (Cal.) Open in 1952. She has also won Vare Trophy three times—in 1953 with a 74.7 scoring average, in 1966 with 74.7 and in 1967. The Associated Press has three times voted her the Women Athlete of the Year—in 1939, 1943 and 1955.

PATTY CHEERFULLY admits that she has been playing competitive golf for almost a quarter of a century. She has been playing since her age, the amiable red head explains: "I began playing golf when I was 15, and I've been playing for the last 24 years."

As a youngster, Patty turned to skating when she decided there was no future in football. She won the Minnesota speed skating championship in 1933 and 1934. She began to play golf with characteristic determination in 1933. By 1935, she won the Minnesota state championship and was runner-up in the National Amateur.

From then on, it was a steady procession to the winner's circle for the spunky redhead. Name any major ladies' tournament and the name of Patty Berg pops up. She has won all 11 except the LPGA championship, which has been held only three times. She tied for the LPGA crown in 1950 but lost to Marlene Hagge in the playoff.

The 1956 LPGA, incidentally, was held at Forest Lake. The girls made such a terrific hit that Forest Lake officials have been most anxious to bring them back. "Heavens no!" she fairly exploded. "Why would I think about quitting this wonderful game of golf? It has been wonderful to me and I intend to stick with it as long as I can hold out!"

From all indications, Patty can hold out forever.

City Caring For 7 Fields

Birmingham's seven "major" baseball diamonds are being maintained by the city for the remainder of June, City Manager L. R. Gare reported in a letter to the city commission Monday night.

A decision to provide funds to maintain three Elom park fields, two at St. James and one each at the high school and Derby junior high was made at a special meeting June 17 arranged by the vice chairman of the recreation board. Officials of Birmingham's Babe Ruth and Little League organizations had asked the city commission the night before for assistance in caring for the fields.

Forestry and parks department superintendent Charles Gale told the commission Monday night he will check the unsafe list in a report forwarded by the Little League and Babe Ruth groups to the recreation board and correct the conditions he concurs with at city expense.
