WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

Leukemia

Q. Is it correct to say that leukemia is "cancer of the blood"?

A. It would be better to say that leukemia is cancer of the blood-forming organs. Even this is not technically correct unless "cancer" is used in terms of how body cells behave. As in other forms of cancer, the basic trouble in leukemia lies within the body cells.

Q. Is leukemia as deadly as other forms of cancer?

A. Yes, and much more so than most forms of cancer. There is no known way to cure leukemia but doctors do have ways of prolonging the life of many unfortunate victims of this disease—something that was not possible a few years ago. Recent animal experiments using bone marrow injections may lead to better ways of treating leukemia.

Q. Can leukemia be inherited?

A. The question is still pretty much up in the air. One doctor estimates that the chance of a relative of a patient with leukemia getting the disease is 1 in 250 as compared with 1 in 4,000 in the case of families in which no member has had leukemia. Leukemia can strike twice in one family but it does not happen very often.
