Sewer Search Turns Up 'Lost' Street Project

Birmingham city officials last week went searching for a reported sewer project — and came back with a forgotten special assessment district.

Here's how it happened: City commissioners were in the midst of approving the city's 1958 summer roadbuilding program when John W. Greenleaf, 1798 Pembroke, asked why nearby Graefield street couldn't be paved rather than oiled.

HE RECALLED that improvement proposals were shelved in August 1954 because of some needed sewers. He thought the street involved was Graefield.

City Manager L. E. Gare and City Engineer Grover Serenbetz were quick to deny any new sewer was needed on Graefield.

Serenbetz got the Graefield records from his office. He reported the Graefield file certainly contained no sewer plans.

AS COMMISSIONERS were figuring out the sewers Greenleaf mentioned were installed on Eton and Derby in Troy township, Serenbetz made a discovery: In August 1954, the city declared necessity for paving Graefield from the terraces north.

Somewhere, the project was "lost" and the special assessment roll never confirmed.

SO THE commission told Gare to get all the background together so the costs could be re-estimated. A date set for a confirmation hearing.

Then commissioners went on to approve assessment rolls for putting a new oil mat and seal coat on eight streets, light oil treatment on portions of eight others, and a seal coat on 57 additional streets.

Candidates To Be Selected For Air Academy

WASHINGTON — Candidates for appointment to the Air Force Academy next year are sought by Congressman William S. Broomfield (R-Oakland, Mich.). Deadline is June 12.

Broomfield said that 11 applicants will be chosen from Oakland County to compete in examinations for his one nomination to a four-year course at the Air Academy near Denver, Colo. Last year, candidates were chosen in a state-wide basis, rather than by Congressional District.

Candidates face tough medical, physical and mental examinations before they will be accepted cadets at the new Academy — the Air Force equivalent of West Point and Annapolis, said Broomfield.

PRELIMINARY mental examinations will be given in July, while preliminary physical examinations will be given at a later date.

Half the career officers of the Air Force will be supplied by the new Air Academy.

Eligibility requirements for the Air Academy (the strictest of all three armed services) are: The Candidate must be a citizen of the United States; of good moral character; at least 17 years old and not yet 22 by July 1, 1959; unmarried, and must never have been married, and medically qualified for flight training.

Prospective candidates are urged to write Congressman Broomfield, Room 1422, New House Office Building, Washington 25, D.C.

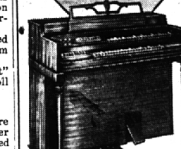
