**Scouts Cook, Serve Dinner**

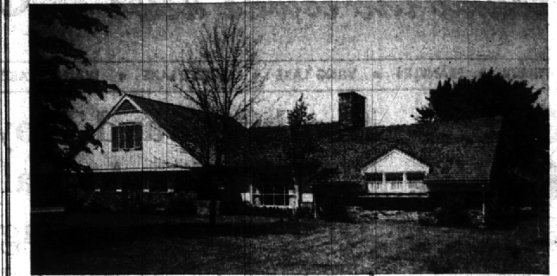

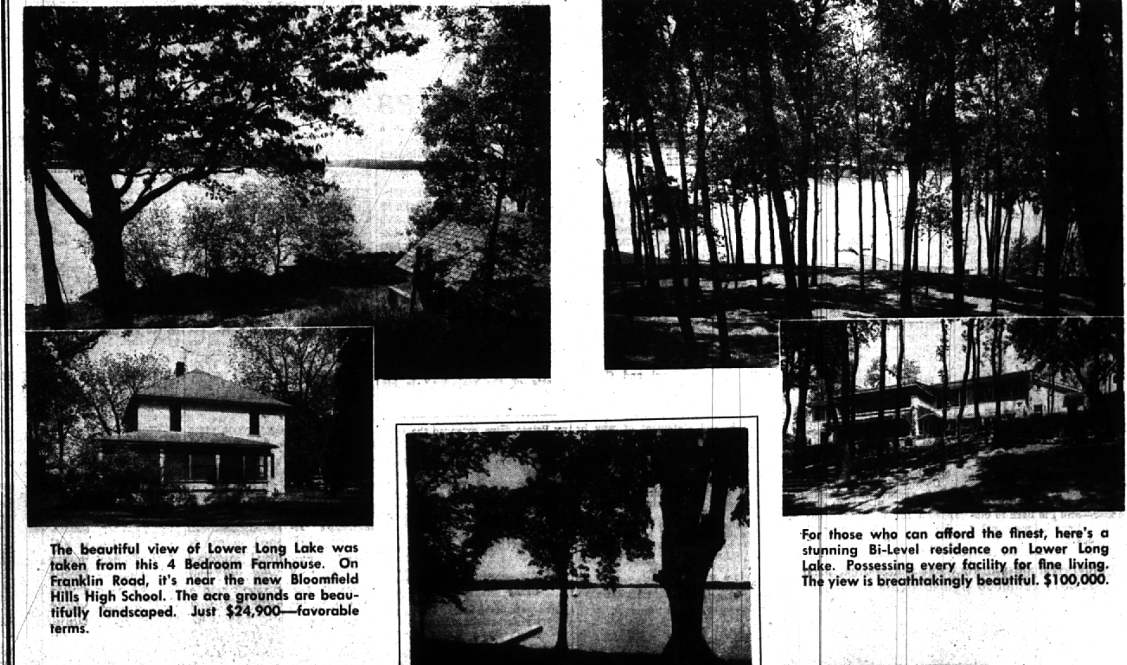
