Work to Perfect Lamprey Killer

The Mosquito river in Alger county, a tributary of Lake Superior, was chemically treated recently as tests of Dowlat, the lamprey-killing chemical, continue.

To date three streams have been treated with the chemical. The first was Little Billy's (Elliott) creek in Cheboygan county last October. In April, Black Mallard river in Presque Isle county was treated.

The latest test was used to iron out engineering difficulties in use and application of the chemical.

In addition to these three streams, nine others are listed for possible control work before the end of the year.

INCLUDED for the Lake Superior watershed are the Silver river in Baraga county, the Chocoy river watershed in Marquette county and the Sucker and Rock rivers in Alger county. On Lake Michigan, the Bark river in Delta county and Carp Lake river in Emmet county await possible control work.

The entire Ojibwee river watershed, Schreiber's creek in Presque Isle county and the south branch of Devil's river in Alpena county are scheduled on the Lake Huron watershed.
