

3 Area Men To Celebrate First Masses

Following their ordination this week and next, three young Roman Catholic priests, members of Birmingham area families, will offer their first masses. Following tradition, they will return to their home parishes for the masses.

Father Richard W. Kropp, son of the Richard B. Kropp, 666 Lakeview, Birmingham, will celebrate his first mass at Holy Name church Sunday at a 10 a.m. solemn high mass.

Father Kenneth John Russell, OSB, will offer his first solemn mass at St. Bede's church, Southfield and 12 Mile road, Sunday, June 15, at 12:15 p.m. Fr. Russell is the son of the George Russells, 19420 Saratoga, Lathrup village.

A Franciscan friar, Fr. Claude Paul Bettendorf, O.F.M., is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Hubert Bettendorf, 1741 Tarry road, Birmingham. Fr. Claude will celebrate his first solemn mass Sunday, June 15, at 10:30 a.m. at the Shrine of the Little Flower church, Royal Oak.

FR. KROPP WILL be ordained in the cathedral at Lansing Saturday, and will be assigned to a parish in the Lansing diocese at the end of June. He was graduated this week from St. John's seminary, Plymouth, Mich. He also studied at St. Gregory's seminary, Cincinnati O., and at Sacred Heart seminary, Detroit.

He attended Summit country day school and is a graduate of Xavier high school at Cincinnati, O. Before entering St. Gregory's he was a student at Xavier university. He traveled in Europe last summer, and spent a previous summer in Mexico.

He will be the first priest from Holy Name parish to say his first mass at the new church building. Following the service relatives and friends of the 26-year-old priest will attend a breakfast in his honor at Pine lake country club.

Fr. Russell will be ordained to the priesthood at St. Mary's Cathedral, St. Cloud, Minn., by Bishop Peter W. Bartholome Saturday. The Rev. Cyril Keating, pastor of St. John's abbey, Collegeville, Minn., he attended Gesu grade school, University of Detroit high school and one year at the University of Detroit college.

The Rev. Cyril Keating, pastor of St. Bede's, will assist Fr. Russell at the June 15 mass, and the Rev. Daniel Durkin, OSB, will give the sermon. A family dinner will follow the mass with benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament followed by a reception and first priestly blessing in the parish social hall from 5 to 7 p.m.

The 26-year-old priest will return to the monastery June 19 for his solemn assignment. FR. CLAUDE will be ordained to the priesthood Friday, June 13, in Holy Family church, Oldenburg, Ind., by the most Rev. Robert Kowalski, O.F.M., DD, exiled Bishop of Wuchang, China.

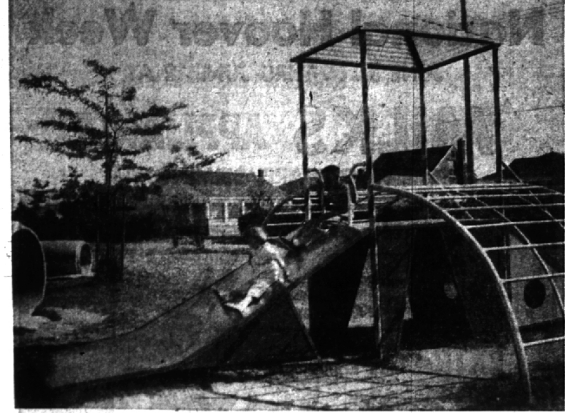
