**City Considering Repayment Period For Added Costs**

Birmingham athletic club revealed last week the issue of 300 bonds bearing three per cent interest, to be priced at \$700 each to finance construction of a pool and clubhouse on the club's six-acre site at W. Maple and Oak Hills drive.

The announcements was made at the club's first meeting, when President Fred Matthei, Jr. introduced the board of directors to the members and their wives who jammed the Birmingham high school little theatre.

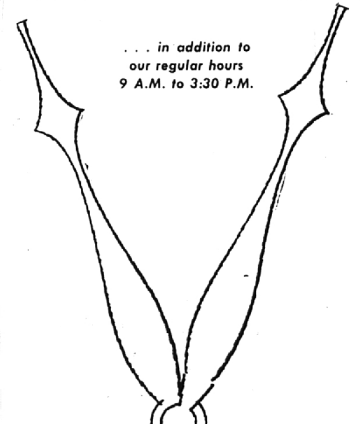
