The "compromise silhouette," with fitted front and loose back shows up as a stronger seller in many cities and is considered one of the most wearable chemise-in- spired fashions.

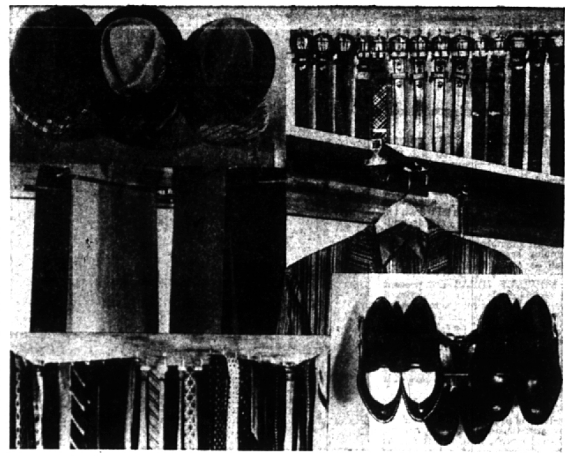
