Volunteers Blessed

At solemn opening exeremonies last week, the Rt. Rev. Monsignor Eugene E. Paddock, pastor and dean of Holy Name church, bestowed the pastoral blessing on each volunteer worker on the Central high school campaign's general phase. Over 600 volunteer workers from St. Bede. St. Columban, Holy Name, St. Hugo of the Hills and Our Lady Queen of Martyrs attended the ceremonies at Holy Name church. They preceded the volunteers' visits to nearly 4,000 parishioners of the five parishes. As of Friday, the campaign to raise funds for building two Catholic high schools on Lahser road near 14 Mile had secured pledges totaling \$516,000. The boys' and girls' schools are expected to cost over \$1 million each.
