

Lathrup Loses Its Federal Aid Plea for Sewers

LATHRUP — The city Monday lost its plea for a \$35,850 federal grant to help pay for the sanitary sewer ordered by the court. The state water resources commission turned down Lathrup's request, extending the deadline for signing sewer treatment contracts with Detroit, which killed the city's hope for federal aid.

Mayor Lantz Mackey said Lathrup had no alternative but to build the sanitary sewer anyway. It is to cost \$295,000. This sewer has been ordered by the courts, and is not the storm sewer which the voters turned down two weeks ago.

Woodcreek Prexy Draws Houghton In Mayor Trade

WOODCREEK FARMS—Village president Alger Clark has another trip in store for him when he returns from his vacation. Clark has drawn Houghton, Mich., for mayor's exchange week in May. During Clark's absence, councilman Norman Krieder officiated as president pro-tem at the March 4 meeting of the council.

A resolution was passed to permit Sterling Garrett, road contractor, to remove dirt from the property of A. W. Riese on Northwest.

The permit expires June 30 and stipulates that Garrett must maintain the required grade of one foot above the road level. Garrett has been in violation of a village ordinance, and the council move to force the early completion of the commercial sand removal which began prior to incorporation. Garrett has been forced to dig deeper for the sand than was first expected due to a heavy layer of clay in the area.

ITEMS for the proposed fiscal budget to be ready for April will be considered by councilman Harry Lang, Jr., as chairman, and Herman Dobson and treasurer M. W. Davenport.

Rubbish collection and police protection discussions were tabled until 8 p.m. Tuesday when the group will hold a special budget meeting at the St. Vincent-Sarah Fisher home.

DR. WOOD, reporting on his exploration of Westwood's drain situation, said the council "ought to consider having an engineering firm do an internal drain survey of the village."

He said this was not a pressing problem yet, but that such a survey would help the council when new housing is proposed and street paving planned.

Dr. Wood also reported that he had built at Greenfield and Beverly roads which will meter the water going now to most of the Westwood area. The water line on 13 Mile road was slated for expansion, he said.
