Over 1,000 families outside the city limits who pay the annual fee of \$10 per family, and an increase of 27% in non-resident family cardholders over those registered in 1956.
Book loans in 1957 soared to a total of 278,000, an increase of 17% in the last six months over the same period in 1956. This indicates that the average individual in the community reads nine to ten books a year, far above the national average.

"THE WORLD measures a community by the intangible as well as the tangible evidences of the things it values. Obviously this great community values books and reading. But of the 72,000 people in the Birmingham-Bloomfield-Franklin-Beverly-Troy area today, some 46,000 are library members.
"How the library might be re-constituted to serve this larger city with many new homes is one of the questions being studied by the citizens' committee for the lack of the public library.
