Parties Original

Adolescent-age boys and girls are attracted to each other in a way, but at the same time are shy and self-conscious. They should have parties together, well-planned in partnership and activity.

At this age they desire social activity together but at the same time are shy and confused when confronted with the actual association with each other. Consequently it is essential to plan a party for them that automatically gives them partners and keeps them busy and interested.

Let's try a progressive Partner Party. Provide each guest with a pencil and score card. For each name, they change partners and at the end, record individual scores on cards. Award prizes for high and boy high and second and third likewise.

HAVE IN A paper bag clips of paper on which are written the names of famous couples such as Mame and Roy, Roy Rogers and Dale Evans, George Burns and Gracie Allen, etc. Have the men's names in one bag and the women's in another. Let them draw for names in their respective bags before starting the first game and repeat this procedure between each game. This gives them a partner to start with and a different one for each game.

First game: Pencil polo. Tell them to draw a straight ladder on paper provided. They may have as many rungs as they like. First player starts with the bottom box of ladder and may move one, two or three boxes up toward the top which is the goal. He does this by writing in an X in the boxes of his choice, one, two or three consecutive ones. The object is to land in the top box first. Best to vary the number of ladder squares each game. Have three games of this with change of partners between each.

SECOND GAME: Toothpick Tower. First player places a toothpick on top of a milk bottle. Second player does the same. Object of game is to keep on piling toothpicks on bottle without knocking any off. First partner to slither stack so as to make toothpicks roll off loses and points go to opponent. Have them play five rounds of this and change partners between each round.

Third game: Go To Jail. First player called "Jailer" Partner is "Guesser." Jailer thinks of a word and Guesser tries to guess it. Jailer makes as many dashes on paper as there are letters in the word he has in mind. On first dash he writes first letter of word and on last dash, last letter of word. If either first or last letter is repeated within the word, he fills it in where it should be.

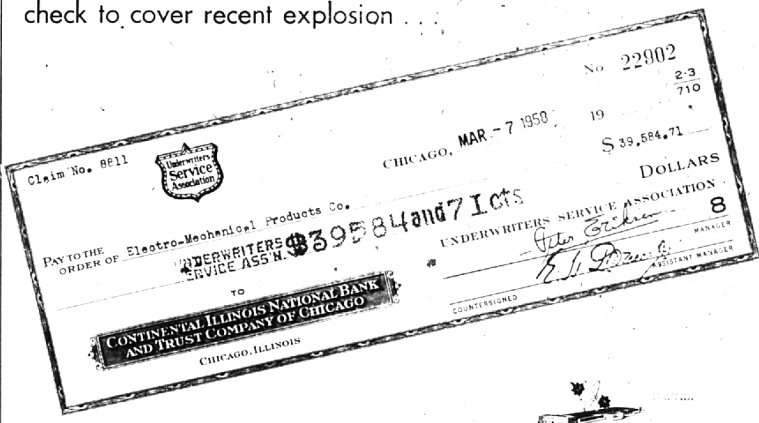
JAILER DRAWS SQUARE framework on his paper resembling door of a cell. Guesser names a letter he thinks should be in the word. If right, jailer writes it in where it belongs. If it appears more than once, he fills it in all proper places. If guesser's letter is wrong, jailer draws a head at top of cellblock. Second wrong guess, he draws body, third left

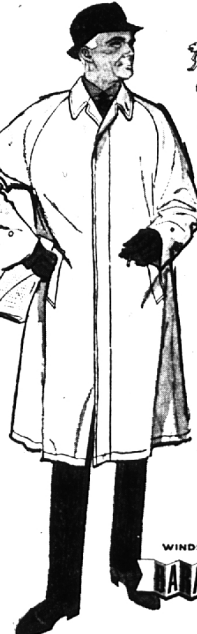
