

Police Move Fast To Catch 2 Boys In Theft of Car

BLOOMFIELD — While Bloomfield township police were hearing a report of a stolen car Saturday night, township officer Henry Jantunen and an auxiliary volunteer picked up two teenagers who were stripping the car in the north end of the township.

Robert Covert, one of the department's newly organized volunteers, heard the report of the car being stolen from Thompson drive. Jantunen was chasing a youngster through a field of South boulevard.

Covert obtained the information to Jantunen, who caught the boys. They were spotted stripping a car belonging to John E. Spade, 525 Hamilton, Bloomfield Village. The youths were putting parts of the car into a pick-up truck.

One of the boys, 16, was taken to juvenile court Monday. The other, Lauren D. Johnson, 17, Pontiac, pled guilty at his arraignment in Oakland county circuit court Monday and was released on \$500 bond. It was his first arrest, but Police Chief Norman Dehnke said parts of other automobiles were found in his home.
