Mrs. G. Lea was in charge of the dinner.

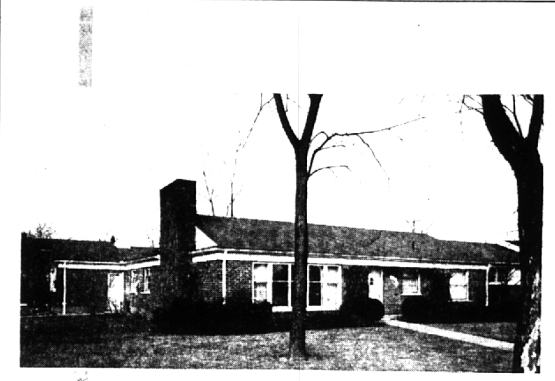
Dinner guests were Mrs. C. Beck, neighborhood chairman and Mrs. L. Hobbs, consultant for the three troops.

**Ruling Hearing**

**HE ANSWERED** yes to the question of the legality of the board's changing (in September, 1957) the routes of the drains and adding more Southfield area, Holland said the board was not required to fix the service area before then. He feels the part of Southfield in the drain area "is as it should be."

Stating that he was "disconcerted" by the state department of health's statement that it would not issue construction permits until convinced the 12-Town drain would not cause increased pollution of the Red Run, Judge Holland said the court "can only rely" on the engineers involved to see that pollution will be controlled by the system they design. The testimony should alert the drain board to take additional safeguards, if needed, he said.

He ruled that it was legal for Oakland county to assume the cost share of Kaskham golf course and the Detroit zoo, which are in the 12-Town district although they are
