The bow and arrow fishing season for rough fish gets underway through May 31. Upper peninsula "bunker anglers" must wait until May 1 to try their shifts against carp, suckers, redbreast, mullet, dogfish and garpike. The season there continues through May. Spears may be used, as well as archery equipment, on legal waters during this season.

In addition, certain waters are open for this type of fishing at night, and anglers may use artificial lights. Spears and bow and arrow, with or without artificial lights, may be used from May 1 to August 15 on designated inland waters for taking carp, dogfish and garpike. Lists of such waters may be obtained from the conservation department's fish division at Lansing, or at the various field district headquarters.

Hunting and fishing pressure in Michigan is greater than any other state, according to annual income from the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Approximately 2,200,000 hunting and fishing licenses were issued in Michigan, Missouri and Wisconsin.

Bechtel, Sintz Selected for Johnson Award

Tom Bechtel and Pete Sintz have been chosen as the 1958 recipients of Birmingham high school's Johnson award. It was announced Tuesday.

The 25-year-old award is given annually to the school's outstanding student-athlete in previous years of the late George E. Johnson, coach and athletic director from 1926 to his death in 1936. Selection is made by an honorary board.

The two swimmers also shared the foldsmity award, given last Thursday at the winter sports banquet. The three thousand award went to Bob Stephenson.

INCREASED HUNTING

A record 41,018 licenses was recorded throughout the nation as a record total of 31,195,182 licenses were issued, an increase of 1,031,352 over the previous record set in the previous year.

The top states in hunting and fishing during the period, with approximate numbers of permit holders were:

Hunting—Michigan, 1,250,000; New York, 1,025,000; Pennsylvania, 998,000; Ohio, 718,000; Indiana, 674,000; California, 665,000; Wisconsin, 652,000; Illinois, 556,000; Minnesota, 547,000; and Texas, 473,000.

Fishing—California, 1,411,000; Minnesota, 1,217,000; Wisconsin, 1,112,000; Michigan, 1,119,000; Ohio, 911,000; Indiana, 846,000; New York, 825,000; Illinois, 826,000; Pennsylvania, 718,000; and Tennessee, 654,000.

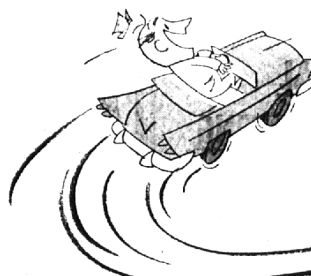
