Checking up on the Mayor

The mayor himself reported early this week at the mobile chest X-ray unit now stationed behind the Birmingham municipal building. Watching Mayor William E. Roberts get his "picture" taken is Dr. Frank J. Condon, health officer for South Oakland, including Birmingham. Roberts says he visits the X-ray unit annually for a check-up. The unit will be in operation from noon to 8 p.m. today, and from 9 to 5 p.m. tomorrow. Registration is in room 108 of the municipal building. Free chest X-rays are offered to all adults 18 and over.

School Addition Costing Less Than Original Building

Bloomfield Hills board of education awarded contracts for an addition to Eastover school Monday at costs which averaged \$1.05 less a square foot than the original construction two and a half years ago. Competitive bidding was the reason for the saving, the board believes.
 Ray Misch and Son, Inc. was named general contractor at \$81,099, plus a two per cent management fee. The board expects the addition to be ready by September, 1958.
 Lloyd F. Thornton was named mechanical contractor with a bid of \$38,425 and an additional \$2,000 for a public address system. Construction costs are estimated slightly over \$14 a square foot. Supt. Eugene L. Johnson said the district also was receiving larger classrooms with more built-in features than in the original school.

POSSIBILITY of hooking onto a branch of the North Evergreen interceptor system at Eastover was discussed.
 The board also studied tight operating budget prospects for the next school year but instructed Johnson to continue with plans to keep classrooms to 25 or fewer students.

Approximately 25 new teachers will be needed to staff the new Pine lake school, Eastover addition and the new junior high school.
 JOHNSON REPORTED that "in general," elementary class rooms have been kept to 25 pupils but that junior and senior high school classes range from 15 to 40 stu-

 She said Precinct 1 (Quarton Lakes estates area) most likely will have more than the state permitted maximum of 1,400 registered voters.
 Precincts 2 and 7 (north of Maple, east of Woodward) also may have to be divided into three precincts, she added.
 The city now has 11 precincts.
