Mrs. Newcomb, Club Woman

Funeral services for Mrs. Brown Kellie Newcomb, a member of the Colonial Dames of America, a prominent club woman who died in her home on Echo road, Bloomfield Hills, Feb. 28, were held in the Bell Chapel of the Wm. R. Hamilton Co. at 1 p.m. Monday. Burial was made in Woodmere cemetery.

Mrs. Newcomb was 87 years of age and was the widow of Cyrus Adelbert Newcomb, Jr. A lifelong resident of the Detroit area, she was one of the 17 founders of the Detroit Nursing association and had lived in Bloomfield Hills since 1947.

She was a life member of the Colonial Dames of America in Michigan and belonged to the Louisa St. Clair Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Other organizations to which she belonged are the American Red Cross, Liggett School alumnae, the YWCA and the Gantbrook Institute of Science.

She was active in the Women's City club of Detroit, the Historical Memorial society and the Woman's National Farm and Garden association.

Mrs. Newcomb was a member of First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Birmingham.
