

Bingham Requests Reclassification Of Bristol Lane

BINGHAM FARMS — Even a Bingham Farms village street administrator, Tol, council colleagues Monday night that he has asked the state to reclassify Bristol lane as a major road. Tol declared that the 33 homes on the road caused increased traffic. Studies revealed that more than 100 vehicles used it every 24 hours, he said.

The council also adopted a resolution to mail residents of the village a letter explaining the council's reasons for urging the passage of an amendment to the charter. The letter interprets the new state law as it will affect the village.

The council learned that soil tests of a seven-acre plot slated for subdividing proved the land unsuitable for septic tank drainage. The project will be abandoned by Engelhardt, Buechner and Holt, who have held an option on it. A public hearing was held in the village in January to determine whether the project should be allowed.
