Club Appoints Slate Committee

WESTCHESTER — The Westchester branch of the WNGFA appointed their nominating committee at their last meeting.

Village of Westwood ORDINANCE NO. 6

Section 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the Village of Westwood Violations Bureau Ordinance.

Section 2. VIOLATIONS BUREAU. The Violations Bureau is hereby established to assist the Court with the Clerical work of traffic cases and traffic violations. The Bureau shall be in charge of the hearing and shall be open at such hours as may be designated by the Village Council.

Section 3. DUTIES. It shall be the duty of the Violations Bureau to accept and receive complaints, prepare summonses, issue notices of traffic violations, and to notify violators of traffic violations and such violations. Such Bureau shall perform such other duties as shall be required of it from time to time by the Village Council.

Section 4. PROCEDURE. Each violator shall be presented by the complaining officer with a traffic summons or ticket, giving the time and date of violation, nature of such, name of officer, car make and license number, and the location of such violation. The officer shall file a conspicuous spot on the vehicle. The violation card shall direct the violator to report at the Violations Bureau at the office of the Director of Public Safety, 18500 W. Thirteenth Mile Road, Westwood Village, where he has the option of paying the predetermined fine as herein-after established for certain violations hereinafter set forth, or having the case tried in court. Such violation card or notice shall require the violator, or someone in his behalf, to appear at the Violations Bureau or at the court as specified in the violation card within the date of such notice. If the violator fails to appear in accordance with the notice given, the Violations Bureau may send to the violator by registered mail a copy of the violation card and a notice notifying him of such violation, and warning him to appear within five (5) days from the date of such notice, to settle such violation penalty, or the officer may request a court order before or after the date of such warning, in the Justice Court in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance or the Village Ordinance, and the case be tried in the usual manner. The provisions of this ordinance shall not be applicable to violations involving reckless driving, driving under the influence of narcotic drugs, or permitting the driving by one under the influence of narcotic drugs or liquor.

Section 5. VIOLATIONS WHICH MAY BE SETTLED AT VIOLATIONS BUREAU. PRE-DETERMINED PENALTIES. AND MICHIGAN UNIFORM TRAFFIC VIOLATION NOTICE. The following violations shall be made prior to the issuance of a warrant, the officer may request a court order before or after the date of such warning, in the Justice Court in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, or the Village Ordinance, and the case be tried in the usual manner. The provisions of this ordinance shall not be applicable to violations involving reckless driving, driving under the influence of narcotic drugs, or permitting the driving by one under the influence of narcotic drugs or liquor.
