

# Romantic Music for Collectors

Learning to love and understand music is cumulative. Your first musical experience and later one become merged in the unconscious. All together they cement a firmer hold on this elusive but enchanting art. Records enable us to return again and again to what might otherwise be only a fleeting sensation.

How is your record collecting? As mentioned before, it is perhaps the best to begin a collection with "romantic" music—music that speaks directly to the emotions without depending for acceptance upon an esoteric knowledge of technique or an advanced conception of tonal relationships.

Later, by dint of listening alone, you instinctively become aware of the more subtle and complicated musical relationships and feel at home with music that at first seems obscure to you.

Here are some records—romantic music you might add to your library:

**TCHAIKOVSKY Swan Lake Ballet:** Eugene Ormandy and the Philadelphia orchestra. COLUMBIA. THE Nutcracker Suite and the Suite from Swan Lake: the best orchestral symphony ever recorded. Desormiere. CAPITAL. Highlights from Swan Lake: Anatole Pritoulet and the London symphony. LONDON.

Melodious and beautifully orchestrated, Tchaikovsky's music in its musical merits without need of literary reference. Of his orchestral symphonies, the "Swan Lake" is the best. Desormiere's rhythmic pace may be better suited to dance tradition, but Ormandy's rendition gives the listener a better all-round conception. The sound of all three discs is good.

**DUKAS The Sorcerer's Apprentice:** WEINBERGER Schwanda-Polka and Wagner: STRAUSS Walden. Seebeck Victor.

**Opus 51: LISZT Les Preludes Dimitri Mitropoulos,** the New York Philharmonic orchestra. COLUMBIA.

All four are virtuoso works for orchestra. The Dukas is humorous and suspenseful; the Strauss is sensuous and suggestive; Schwanda is fun and frolic from start to finish; and Liszt's Les Preludes is a symphonic poem of the best brooding and melancholy aspect. Mitropoulos rises to every challenge with sounds that are round and full.

No explanation is known, but what exists of it is an almost perfect example of symphonic form. Mendelssohn wrote the overture to a Midsummer Night's Dream at the age of 17. It is a fascinating translation of the lyric and witty Shakespearean story into charming musical fantasy. Ormandy's interpretation is completely true to the essential romanticism of both works.

**BETHOVEN Concerto No. 1 in C Major: Sonata No. 28 in E Minor:** Solomon, pianist, Herbert Menges, conductor. Philharmonic orchestra. ANGEL.

This concerto is a direct heir to the later concerto of Beethoven. It is a work of budding romanticism. The work abounds in lovely melody. Soloist and orchestra play to great advantage in their relationships. Solomon plays with a refined approach that sacrifices tone for scholarly interpretation. The sound is good.
