Q. Are diseases such as asthma ever due to emotional upsets?
 A. In most cases of asthma and other allergic conditions, some type of sensitivity or allergy can be found. However, the healthy body functions as a unit with each organ working as smoothly as a well-oiled machine. Put sand in the machine or load a person with emotional gravel and things soon get out of kilter. This does not mean that asthma sufferers need treatment for mental troubles in order to get well but outlook or attitude can be an important factor in many diseases.

Q. Do children ever outgrow asthma?
 A. Some may. Not so long ago two doctors reported that over 600 asthmatic children, about 75 per cent no longer had asthma by the time they reached teenage. A child specialist at Duke Q. is a person apt to dislike University checked 200 asthmatic youngsters. After two to three years treatment, about 80 per cent of the children had few or no symptoms or were greatly helped. The important thing to remember is that asthma can be very serious. Early treatment food that matched up with sensibility a physician can prevent much misery.

Tower to House Old Bell At New School

When the new Pine Lake elementary school opens this fall, it will come equipped with a reminder of an area background rich in tradition and sentiment.

The original Pine Lake rural school was closed two years ago but its school bell was saved. As plans for the new school developed, Bloomfield Hills school district administrators made provisions for a tower to house the bell.

The school board has honored Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Callow, longtime residents of the area, by naming the bell tower for them in recognition of their generosity in the sale of their property on Long Lake road as the site for the new school. Three years ago the Callows sold the site on the district at about half the prevailing price.

It became part of the Bloomfield Hills system eight years ago in a consolidation with Bloomfield Hills, City, Wing Lake and Tuscarora districts. Sewer problems necessitated closing the school, and children from the area now are brought by bus to Vaughan school.
