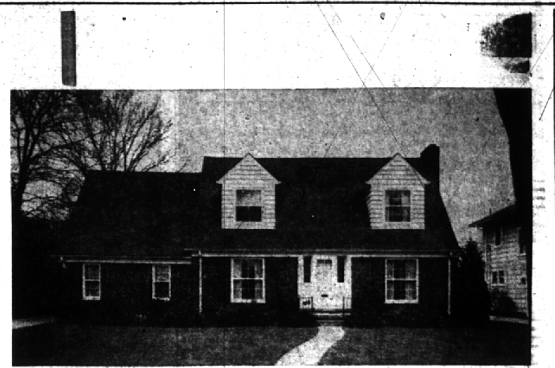
The club's executive board had lunch today at Birmingham country club, preceded by cocktails at the Westmore road home of their president, Mrs. John Smith.

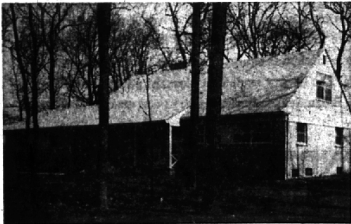

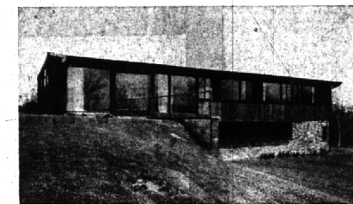

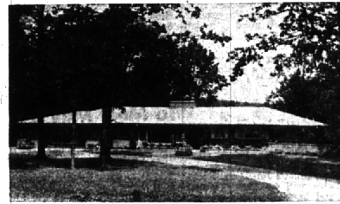
