Around Outdoors

Keymen Play Crucial Role

A vast organization involving thousands of persons—plus mechanized equipment and communications systems—protects Michigan forests, property and lives from destruction by fire.

The fire-fighting organization centers around the conservation department's fire control section, but also includes many private citizens.

Among the most important persons in the organization are some 1,000 "keymen" throughout the state. These keymen are private citizens who voluntarily play a significant role in controlling fire losses by spotting, reporting and helping to suppress fires.

Each of the keymen is supplied by the department with hand equipment for fire-fighting. Alertness of this force, plus the availability of hand tools, often means a small blaze is extinguished before it can spread and become a costly and dangerous forest fire.

PREVENTION and control measures have helped Michigan to establish an enviable record in reducing fire damage. About 25 years ago, the average forest fire in the state devastated approximately 44 acres. Today, the average damage per fire has dropped to less than five acres.

Speed, of course, is an important item in controlling fires because quick suppression saves money, property, valuable natural resources, and perhaps lives.

Fire control experts point out that the public can do its share in preventing needless damage by observing safety measures when using the outdoors and by promptly reporting any outdoor fires sighted.
