**Decide Own Limits**

Why are most drivers stopped by the police? Speeding, of course. In a recent survey by the Institute for Safer Living, 50 out of every 100 drivers questioned stated that they decided for themselves what their speed limit shall be. Of these, 20 per cent stated that they drove over the speed limit on occasion, but 60 per cent admitted they exceeded speed limits as a penalty. Only 20 per cent were careful to drive under posted limits.

**Poor Passing**

How do most drivers behave in regard to passing on curves? Not so well, according to a survey by the Institute for Safer Living. Only 60 out of every 100 stated that they never passed under any conditions. Forty out of 100 advised that if traffic were light, they would pass and did pass on curves. About the same figures hold true among drivers quizzed about passing on hills.

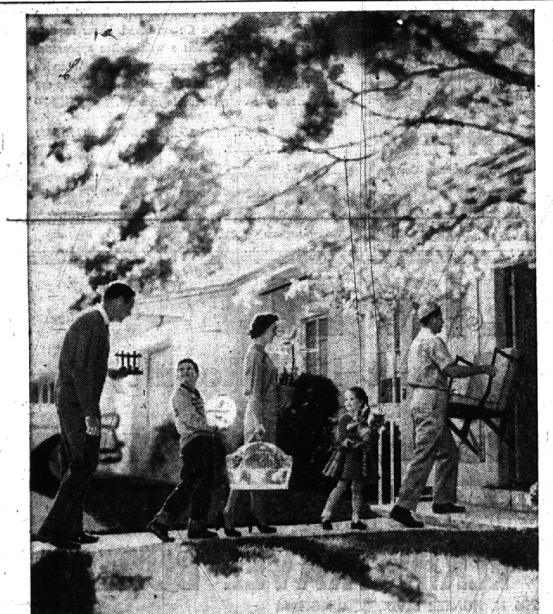
