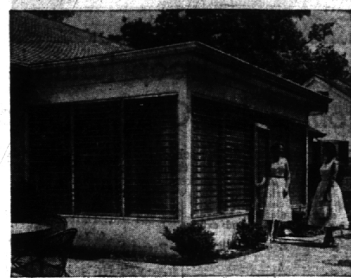
Club Delivers Crab Trees

Use Siding for Improvement

MAY MUSTS

CRABGRASS
The bold must take action now! The weather has favored you by retarding the date for the germination of crabgrass seeds.

The BEST time to apply 72% CHLORDANE to eliminate crabgrass is before any of the seeds germinate. However, don't despair if you don't get it on in time, you can still spend your dough on materials that kill plants. And even a late application will probably eliminate the seeds that haven't yet germinated.

WEEDS (BROADLEAVED)
This is the ideal time to grit your teeth and spray all infested areas with LAWN WEED KILLER. DON'T spot spray unless you have to. Spray the WHOLE AREA involved. Then forget it until the middle of September.

BARBECUE
Spray the whole... wait a moment... we forget to change the record. Pause—change—
