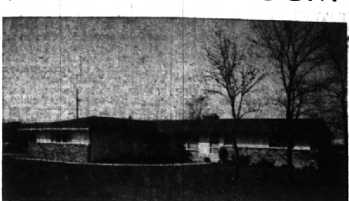
Have You Met . . .

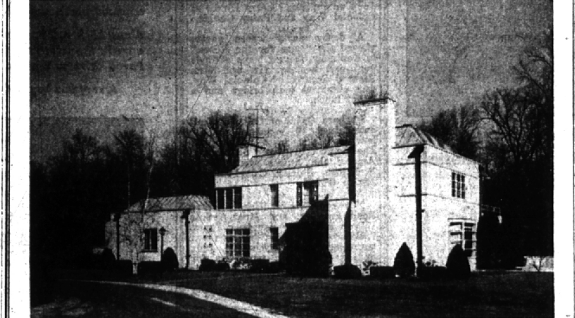
