A new organ, the gift to the congregation of the Robert Vanderkloos, the John Stevensons, and the Paul McKennys, will be dedicated Sunday at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer.

The services will be conducted at both 9:30 and 11 a.m.

Nancy Lewis Kochenderfer, organist at the church, will play a recital of organ music, which includes "Festiva! Tocatta" by Perle.

The original recital organ was installed in 1942, and much of it has been high school and college three-manual organ. Its 20 sets of pipes, 1450 altogether, are housed in chambers on the west side of the chancel.

ALSO INSTALLED in the new organ are the Edward J. Hill in 1947.

The Schumierer carillon bells were presented by Clara K. and Robert C. Vanderkloot in 1949 in honor of William S. Knudsen and Peter Robert Vanderkloot. The bells are also playable from the console of the new organ.

Miss Kochenderfer was graduated from the University of Michigan in 1950 with a degree of bachelor of music. In June, 1951, she represented the Detroit chapter of the American guild of organists by playing on organ recital at the regional convention in Indiana.

The following year she was the official organist for the noonday Lenten services sponsored by the Detroit Council of Churches.
