WHAT DOCTORS SAY ABOUT

• "Listening" During Sleep • Fluoridation

Q. Can you listen for certain sounds during sleep?  
A. Yes. A mother can sleep soundly while trucks or trains rumble past her window but will awaken promptly at the slightest whimper of her sick child. Doctors at Walter Reed Army Institute of research conducted an interesting experiment along these lines. They trained cats to "listen" for clicking sounds about 50 per cent. Such was generally considered perfectly safe. However, a New Orleans doctor contends that fluoridated water irritates the gums. It is safe to drink?

Q. Does fluoride in drinking water actually reduce tooth decay? Is it safe to drink?  
A. Consumption of water containing small amounts of fluoride seems to reduce tooth decay about 50 per cent. Such water is generally considered perfectly safe. However, a New Orleans doctor contends that fluoridated water irritates the gums. It is safe to drink?
