CRANBROOK—The 10th annual exhibition of student work goes on view to the public at Cranbrook academy of art galleries Saturday, according to Wallace Mitchell, galleries head.

The exhibition, planned and installed by the students, covers the year's work through selections from the academy's seven departments: painting, sculpture, design, architecture, ceramics, metalworking and weaving. It remains on view daily from 2 to 5 except Monday and major holidays, through Sept. 21.

'Don't Pave Cranbrook,' Residents Ask

Bloomfield Hills city fathers, often pressured for better roads, received a reminder of that lesson Tuesday when residents of Cranbrook road appeared to ask them not to pave Cranbrook.

Roger M. Kyes, 846 Cranbrook, Ernest A. Jones, 990 Cranbrook, and Philip Monaghan, 840 Cranbrook, sought instead better drainage ditches to keep water off the road. The three are residents of the hilly section of Cranbrook road which the city had scheduled to be paved with concrete from Woodard avenue to Kingswood school.

MONAGHAN presented pictures taken before and after the road had been repaired, showing extensive water damage. City Manager Elmer Kephart explained that the narrowness of the road would make the usual six-inch crowns unsafe.

Kyes pointed out that paving would cause removal of many trees and a scenic section of the stone wall bordering Kingswood road. "We're a bunch of moles," Kyes commented, "for we don't want Cranbrook to become a main road."

COMMISSIONER Lyman J. Craig assured him that the commission had many other places to spend \$35,000 and would "give the paving a second look" should it see what drainage work could be done.

The commission delayed asking Kephart to prepare a tax roll for paving Linda lane until the regular meeting June 10 as there is a possibility of extending the road to include additional lots.

This session also was a public hearing on the 1959 budget which was approved as presented by Kephart. It totals \$249,000, which is a \$4,444 increase over last year's. The tax rate remains the same, \$20 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. No one appeared at the meeting to protest the budget or tax.

Kingswood Grads To Hear Hannah At Commencement

CRANBROOK — President of Michigan state university, Dr. John A. Hannah, will deliver the commencement address to the graduating class of Kingswood School Cranbrook Saturday afternoon, June 14, in Christ Church Cranbrook.

Dr. Hannah has been president of Michigan State University since 1941 with the exception of the years 1953-54 when President Eisenhower appointed him assistant secretary of defense for manpower and personnel.

Last December President Eisenhower appointed him to serve as chairman of the civil rights commission, delegated to make a two-year study of it.

An alumnus of Michigan state university, Dr. Hannah has been awarded honorary degrees by many institutions.
