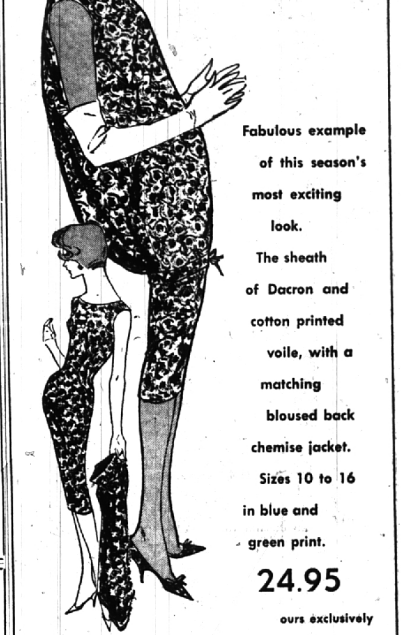
# Bradford Student

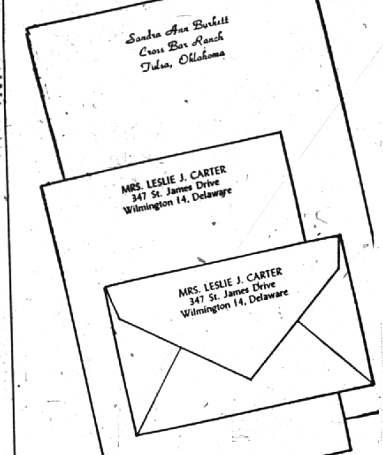
