

## Scooter Rider, 13, Hurt in Accident

BLOOMFIELD — Robert Borzon, 13, of 1884 Kirkway, received a severe leg wound in a motor-scooter accident Tuesday at Long Lake and Andover roads.

Borzon was riding his scooter east on Long Lake road when a station wagon driven by Mary J. Van der Meer, 18, of 2225 Intaken, Orchard Lake, turned off Andover onto Long Lake. Borzon attempted to miss the station wagon but hit the front of it.

The boy had been warned by Bloomfield township police a week ago not to ride the scooter as he is under age. Permits are issued

with parents' consent to 14-year-olds. Borzon will not be 14 until December.

He was taken to St. Joseph Mercy hospital, Pontiac, where 50 stitches were taken in the right leg. Skin grafting may be necessary.

Denhke warned all under-age youngsters riding motor-scooters that from now on the police will issue no more warnings but will confiscate the scooters the first time they are caught riding them. Entirely too many youngsters under 14 are riding scooters, he said.
