East Beverly Paving to Be Started Soon

WESTWOOD—Dusty East Beverly residents Monday were asked for "only a little more patience"—their street paving program will begin soon.
Councilman Ted Shurtleff reported that work on the water line on Greenfield was to begin Wednesday and be finished before it would conflict with paving of abutting streets.

Mid Struder of Johnson and Anderson engineering firm said Tuesday that the asphalt paving season opens May 15, and that the paving contract calls for work to begin within 10 days of that date and be finished within 60 days. He pointed out that streets in this area dry slowly, and that the final starting date depends on the weather.

The paving project, approved last year, covers about three miles of residential streets in a half square mile area between Greenfield and Pierce and will be paid by special assessment. Streets involved include Amhurst, Lauderdale, Resmeade, Wetberby, Sheridan, Arlington, Glenoee, Auburn, Beverly circle, Kinross and Dunblaine. Beverly and Pierce will not be asphalted.
