The budget allows about \$950 for contingencies with an additional \$100 set aside in the miscellaneous fund, and \$500 for rubbish pick-up, to cover costs after contracts made by the Woodcreek Civic association terminate in January.

Councilman Harry Lang, Jr. was appointed inspector of the village. Councilmen Harry Dobson and Dr. Zar Reader were appointed to a special committee to study road and traffic conditions. Road administrator Donald Wells urged restrictions on over-loaded trucks and Lang indicated that limits on weights and speeds plus stop signs at strategic intersections would discourage through traffic.

Residents will be asked to remove their rural delivery mail boxes for the first days in July to enable road graders to clean shoulders and scrape excess gravel towards the center of roads. In order that mail delivery is not interrupted, councilmen Norman Kieder and Lang will notify residents of the day graders will work on each road and boxes on posts will be removed for that day.

With the planning commission prepares Woodcreek Farms' zoning map and ordinance, the council adopted a subdivision regulation ordinance to control the platting of new subdivisions.

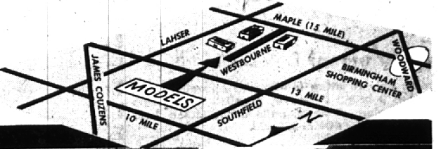
