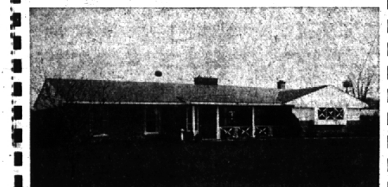
A new arrival to the Peter T. Swallow house of Rackham boulevard is David Thomas, born April 15, Sunday David was baptized at St. Bede's church.

### Hofmanns Attend Credit Convention

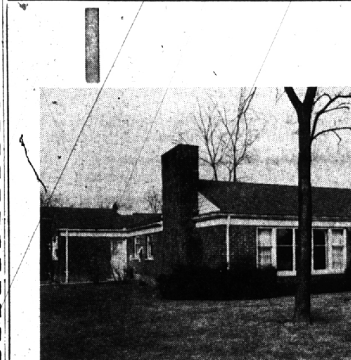
