TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a Special School Election will be held in said School District on Monday, December 8, 1958.

Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, as amended, provides in part as follows:

"The Inspectors of Election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides . . ."

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the appropriate city or township clerk of the city or township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said Special Election is Friday, November 28, 1958. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time on said Friday, November 28, 1958, will not be eligible to vote at said Special School Election.
