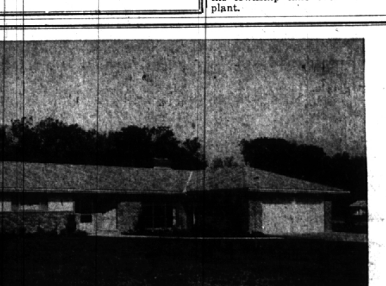

The board accepted Case's recommendation to deny the request of Colberry park subdivision that the township take over its sewer plant.

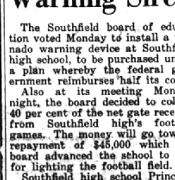
