### LATHRUP RESIDENTS WARNED

## Rock Fences Present Hazard to Motorists

**LATHRUP**—Lawn-loving Lathrup residents are being cautioned by their interest in protecting their grass and the boulders they place at the side of the city's roads grow bigger and bigger.

So said city administrator Jerald Stone Monday evening and road committee chairman Tom Reed agreed with him.

Stone said that some road residents had placed barriers along the road in front of or beside their property.

"I DON'T know how they got some of them there in the first place," Stone said. "We could threaten to carry them away, but I don't see how we could pick them up."

"Some of those rocks are as high as a chair," Reed told the council. "With a little frosting of snow," he continued, "they could wreck a car."

It cost the city \$10,000 to repair the snow plow blade, because it continually hits them, Stone said. Boulders along the side of the road have done severe damage in the past.

Lathrup residents have hit upon fancy gimmicks to keep cars from running off the road onto their lawns. Reed said that every road should have a 3 ft. shoulder of gravel, but that in some instances drainage ditches are too close to the road to leave much of a shoulder and home owners plant grass right up to the road edge.

BESIDE boulders of assorted colors and sizes, residents use plain and painted concrete blocks, logs, odd metal shapes or anything available to keep wheels on the pavement.

writing commission, feel certain that two-thirds of the electors voting "thereon" was implied in the wording of the charter on the matter.

Four other clauses of the charter dealing with similar voting include the word "thereon," which he feels was accidentally omitted in the chapter XIV on village utilities.

The whole ball of wax is being sent to Harold Schone, Oakland's DPW director, including Franklin's opinion, for a final interpretation by binding officials.

If they are not satisfied that the vote was conclusive, Franklin voters may have to decide the issue a second time in the March general election.

**COUNCILMAN** William Worcester estimated that 15 per cent of village election funds had been spent to prove nothing.

President Grant Silver suggested a committee to review the charter to clarify such possible inconsistencies which might now again lead the council up a blind alley.
