This was to be the last time they were on the short end of the tally.

The locals' defense finally solved the visitors' attacking patterns and forced them to kick. Ed Bush circled under the punt and after backtracking while looking for running room sped up the east run behind some beautiful downfield blocking.

This time the conversion was good and Birmingham left the field enjoying a 20-14 halftime lead.

COMING BACK strong after the intermission, the Maples began where they left off on the hapless Bluejays by moving, 62 yards for the touchdown.

Ed Bush skirted end for the final seven yards and his second TD of the night. Forrester's point after touchdown attempt was good to give the Maples a 27-14 lead at this point.

The visitors were not done yet, however. Led by Pilar, they stormed to the locals' two-yard stripe before a fumble halted their drive. Stopping the locals completely in the last period, Pilar later scored for the Bluejays to make the verdict read 27-31.

BUSCH's two touchdowns gave him a total of 15 for the year and a point aggregate of 90 to make him one of the leading scorers in the past several seasons. A mid-season injury made it impossible for him to better ex-captain Tom Tracy's record as he never quite regained top form.

Phil Russell played his finest game of the year as he ended his high school career. Russell, too, was hampered by injuries throughout the campaign and he never quite reached the form predicted of him.

Birmingham this year finished second in the EMT following Port Huron's crushing defeat of Hazel Park. The Maples put the only blot on Port Huron's record when the two teams tied earlier.

LANSING, Nov. 20 — Pheasant hunters bagged more than one million birds for the sixth consecutive year this past season, according to Conservation department esti-

mates based upon spot-checks and regional censuses. This figure represents an approximate 10% dip in hunter success as compared to last year's to-

tal and reflects a pre-season prediction that the kill would remain unchanged. Early surveys indicated an increase in the state's pheasant sup-


